Shawnee Girls' Swim Team Wins South Group B Sectional Title

S hawnee Girls Swim Team etched another chapter into their history by clinching the South Group B Sectional Title for the second consecutive year. Last year's win marked the first in the school's history. A highlight of their season unfolded at the nail-biter Sectional Finals, where victory hung in the balance until the final relay. "It was as close as a meet can get!" Coach Meghan Warren said. Despite graduating some strong seniors last year, the team, fueled by determination and a relentless spirit, rallied to secure the win. "They really swim for each other, not just themselves, and it makes all the difference," Warren emphasized.

With a commendable 9-3 record, the Shawnee Girls showcased their commitment to excellence. Camryn Tilger (sophomore), Summer Sky Bontrager (senior), Alaina Allbaugh-Heinz (sophomore), Ellie Walsh (sophomore), and Sofia Caravello (freshman) emerged as top scorers. Still, Coach Warren stressed the importance of team effort. "Places 1-5 score in Individual events and places 1-3 score in relays. You need the whole team; every swimmer makes a difference," she said. Shawnee swimmers also broke four records this season. Tilger broke the 200 IM and 100-fly records; Bontrager broke the 100-free record; and the 400-free relay team of Bontrager, Walsh, Allbaugh-Heinz, and Tilger broke a relay record that had stood for 22 years!

Guided by team captains Bontrager, Gracie Peterson, and Styliana Kokolis, the team honed their skills and navigated highs and lows with unwavering resolve from November to March.

Warren expressed gratitude for the support of students, faculty, Shawnee's athletic director, Rich Dodd, and assistant coach Carson McBain. "He was a great addition to our team this year," she said.

Warren also credits swim team parents for late-night practice pick-up, pre-meet snacks, pasta parties, and bus decorating. "Our team truly is a family, and that includes our parents. They are always there to cheer us on, and knowing we have their support means a lot to the girls," she said.

Fifth-year coach Meghan Warren is a former swimmer for Shawnee herself. "It's truly special to be back as a coach," she said.
